#### HOME OF THE BIG NICKEL

The city of Sudbury was once a major lumber centre and a world leader in nickel mining. Mining and related industries dominated the economy for much of the 20th century. Today, Sudbury has expanded to emerge as the major retail, economic, health and educational centre for Northeastern Ontario. Considered the largest city in northern Ontario, Sudbury's population resides in an urban core with many smaller communities are scattered around 300

lakes and among hills of rock. It is also home to a large Franco-Ontarian population that influences its arts and culture.

Sudbury is home to notable Canadians, including Alex Trebek (former host of television game show Jeopardy!)

- 330 lakes over 10 hectares (25 acres) within the city limits
- One of the largest francophone communities in Ontario, with approx 22% of locals listing French as their mother tongue in 2021.
- Strong presence of Irish, French-Canadian, Polish and Italian communities has led to a strong Catholic influence in the city
- Main industries include mining, film industry, education and health care
- Home to the world's largest neutrino detector international leader in subatomic physics research.
