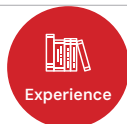
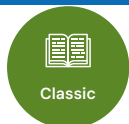
Explore the world of technology and innovation with a **strong emphasis on robotics classes and clubs**, preparing students for a tech-driven future.

Grades 9–12: The High School operates on a semester system. Students take 4 courses per semester. Total annual = 8 courses. The class schedule allows for 4 x 75 minute classes daily.

Grades 7–8: The Middle School follows the same start/end time, but classes are blended on a linear basis; students take all classes from September to June. Students remain with their same peer group and teacher for the majority of their classes.

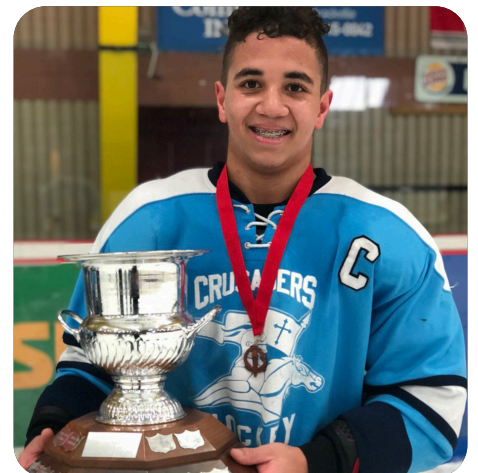
