

- Uniforms are to be worn throughout the school day, and at all times while on school property (including parking lot).
- Uniforms are to be neat, clean, and in good repair (no altering of style or colour).
- Shorts and kilts are to be worn at 3/4 thigh level.
- Extreme over-sizing or under sizing is not allowed.
- Appropriate footwear must be worn.
- No tucking of pant legs into footwear. Pant legs must be worn at the intended length.
- Non-uniform clothing over or under the STA uniform is not allowed.
- Students who are not in uniform or do not meet the uniform requirements, will report to the Office. Their parents will be contacted and appropriate disciplinary actions will be taken. The school administration reserves the right to suspend students from their remaining classes or to send home students who are not dressed in accordance with this uniform policy.
- No hats or any other head gear or sunglasses are to be worn in the school
- Hair should be kept clean, neat, and reasonably styled
- Face jewellery, other than earrings and small nose studs are not allowed
- Scarves are not allowed as an accessory

"CIVVIES" DAYS: The expectations of appropriate attire, which govern all of us, are still in place during all Civvies days. Clothing worn on a 'Civvies' Day should be modest and appropriate to the Catholic School/classroom environment. Spirit Wear may be worn on Civvies Days.

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
