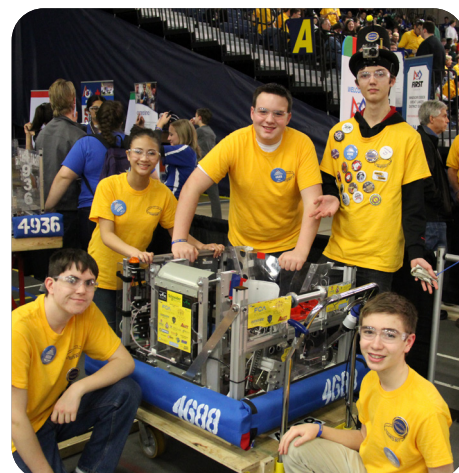

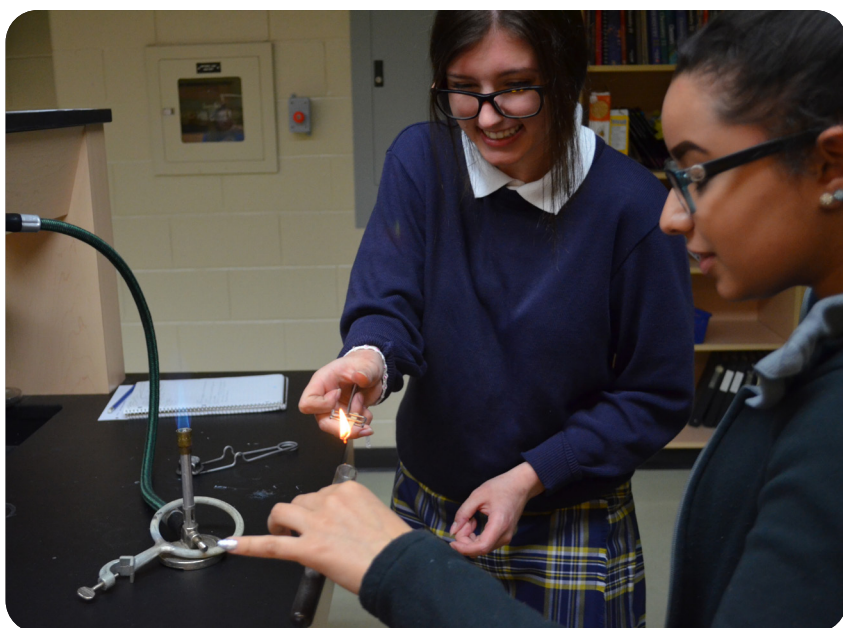

# UNIFORMS

Recommendation is 5 tops, 2 bottoms, and 1-2 sweaters to best meet your needs throughout the year. Additional items can be purchased as needed during the school year.

<b>Tops</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• White Short Sleeve Golf Shirt or Long Sleeve Golf Shirt</li> <li>• White or Blue Short Sleeve Dress (Jac) Shirt or Long Sleeve Dress (Jac) Shirt</li> <li>• Navy Crew Neck Sweater</li> <li>• Navy Cardigan Sweater</li> <li>• Sweatshirts as sold by school (Spirit Wear)</li> </ul>
<b>Bottoms</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Navy or Grey Dress/Cotton Pant</li> <li>• Navy Walking Shorts may be worn from May 1 to the Thanksgiving long weekend with socks.</li> <li>• Kilt/Skort; cut at approximately 19" (inches)</li> </ul>
<b>Socks &amp; Belts</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Only non-textured nylons/leotards/tights in solid, matching colours are permitted.</li> </ul>
<b>Shoes</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Any shoes – must compliment the uniform both in style and colour .</li> </ul>
<b>Gym</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Available through the school. Approx \$35 for 1 shirt and 1 pair of shorts</li> </ul>



All students must be in full uniform while on school property and while representing the school in the community. Students are expected to wear the school uniform proudly and neatly. A student will not be admitted to class if he or she is not in proper uniform. If a student is not admitted to class, he or she will be responsible for all work missed.

- **Gym uniform:** Tshirt, shorts and/or sweat pants is mandatory if taking a physical education class. Estimate cost: \$25-\$30 CAD

The following items may be worn with a student's uniform:

- **Belts:** If belts are worn they must be plain and black. No distracting or offensive buckles are permitted. No other makeshift belts are permitted (shoe laces etc).
- **Jewelry:** Must be neat, respectable and inoffensive. No spiked or studded bracelets, necklaces and earrings are permitted.
- **Undershirts:** Only short-sleeved PLAIN WHITE t-shirts are permitted under the school shirt. The length of the sleeve of the undershirt must not exceed the length of the sleeve of uniform shirt.
- **Spirit days:** Throughout the school year, students will be allowed to share their school spirit by wearing an Archbishop Denis O'Connor Catholic High School sweater, jersey, hoodie or logoed item in place of a second layer.
- **Non-uniform day:** On non-uniform days students must be dressed in clothing appropriate for a Catholic secondary school. Parent and guardians will be contacted and students may be sent home if dressed inappropriately. No head wear is permitted. Shorts are not permitted before May 1.
