Shoes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only non-textured nylons/leotards/tights in solid, matching colours are permitted. For safety reasons, no open-toed footwear is permitted in any technical area, phys ed and/or in science rooms during labs.
Gym	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All students taking Physical Education are required to wear an Noly Names T-Shirt & Shorts purchased from the school (approx. \$35 CAD)

- The uniform must be worn in the manner it was designed
- Shirts are to be buttoned to within two buttons from the collar. Pulling back the shirt and otherwise tightening it using any kind of fastener or tie is not permitted.
- Only a plain white short-sleeved shirt may be worn under school uniform shirts.
- Any T-Shirt worn with the school shirt must be plain white and have sleeves corresponding to the length of the school shirt
- Pants must be worn at the waistline, buttoned, and no undergarments can be exposed at any time.
- The skort must be worn at a modest length. Students are not permitted to roll or alter the skort to a shorter length.

Spirit Wear

- School spirit wear is not part of the official uniform. This includes team and club shirts and sweatshirts, sportswear, team jerseys, etc. Students are given special permission to wear some spirit wear items (i.e. team and club shirts and sweatshirts) on Fridays. On Fridays the school spirit wear must be worn with proper uniform pants, shorts or skorts.
